

Here at His ashram, He continues to bestow His Grace on all who come. It is remarkable how often I meet someone who is visiting the ashram for the first time, who may not have even known about Baba before coming, and when I ask them about their visit, a most often refrain I hear is, "I feel like I've come home."


Maharaj-ji said, "All are my family" and since the ashram is Baba's place and home, it seems that the ashram is fulfilling one of its missions to be a home for all His family.




This past year saw all the ashram's festivals increase in size as more and more of Maharaj-ji's family come for celebrations and daily visits. The first of the ashram's celebrations every year is an all-night puja for Maha Shivaratri. Shivaratri has the distinction of being the smallest of the ashram's celebrations and is the one that is mostly centered on the performance of puja, allowing those who participate to honor Shiva, the Formless Absolute.



The favorite celebration of Baba's Indian devotees,
Hanuman Jayanti, continues to grow with more
devotees attending each year. Devotees from across the
world were in attendance this past Hanuman Jayanti;
approximately 1,400 people received bhandara prasad
and participated in the 24 hours of chanting the
Hanuman Chaleesa. Mahendra Bhai performed a fire
ceremony while chanting 108 Chaleesas and offering
mantra and coconuts to the sacred fire. In addition, after
the Chaleesas and bhandara prasad, the Sundarakanda
was sung in the mandir in the afternoon. The flow of
love and devotion was palpable!



The full moon in July is the time the ashram celebrates Guru Purnima. This is one of the ashram's smaller celebrations and perhaps the sweetest and most intimate. Fewer attendees allows for more personal interaction, and because it is the time when it's said it is best to worship the Divine in form and when the Guru (dispeller of darkness) is said to be the most accessible, the vibration was incredibly blissful and full of devotion.









This year, the annual Mahasamadhi Bhandara celebration coincided with the 50th anniversary of Sri Neem Karoli Baba's Mahasanadhi. It was, to say the least, an incredible jam-packed three-day continuous celebration of Maharaj-ji. Not only was the Hanumn Chaleesa chanted for 24 hours in the mandir, but simultaneously, in Baba's Darshan Hall the Sri Ramcharitmanas was also chanted for 24-hours. Following the chanting, a particularly delectable prasad bhandara was served to the more than 1,400 devotees who came to honor Baba.



In addition, following the Chaleesas, a wonderful group of singers chanted the Sundarakanda in the mandir all afternoon. Saturday evening, after an incredibly fun and fruitful auction, everyone was treated to a slide show of Maharaj-ji and the personal stories of some of the western devotees who had the good fortune to sit with Him in His form in the 60's and 70's. It was an event full of tears of devotion, laughter, and unadulterated love. The festivities continued Sunday and after another amazing prasad feast for lunch, the Ramlila was performed. As always, it was pure joy to see the children and adults re-enacting the age-old drama together. It was enjoyed with so much laughter and so much





love. The blessings and grace of having Maharaj-ji in our lives is beyond compare.

The celebration of the Devi, Navaratri, this year felt particularly poignant, as the ashram began construction of a shrine to the Mother this past summer. The shrine will be dedicated to Sri Pujaniya Siddhi Ma and will be a place for devotees to connect with the Divine in the form of the Devi. Navaratri is a nine-day celebration centered on worship of the different forms of the Mother. Many devotees participated and helped by attending to the many details of the puja in the mandir, as well as the sacred fire ceremony and yantras that are created for it. The blessings and lessons from Navaratri continue to flow into the New Year.



Sri Siddhi Ma's shrine will be located behind the mandir on the west end of the pond. It will be a small open-air structure and inside there will be photos of Sri Siddhi Ma, Jivanti Ma, and Maharaj-ji on the back wall and a small altar with Siddhi Ma's feet carved in rose quartz set in a lotus centered on it. By Their Grace, the shrine and garden will be complete in the summer of 2024 and a consecration ceremony will be held. The ashram has initiated a fundraiser on its giving page to raise the funds to complete this sacred project. The projected amount to complete the shrine and memorial garden is \$100,000 and by Maharaj/Ma's Grace, already \$45,000 has been donated.



As I sat on the front lawn of the Taos Ashram 19 years ago, all I could think about was how angry I was that I got stuck at this stupid temple on my birthday, and how my best friend betrayed his promise that we would head out to explore New Mexico. He was inside chanting some prayer to a monkey, so I decided I would give this meditation thing a try. I sat still and concentrated on my breath, but the blazing sun in the stillness of midday was too much to handle. My discomfort was unbearable. I spoke aloud from frustration and called to this "Maharajji" guy. I requested that, if he did exist, I needed

just a hint of comfort so that I could experience stillness and peace.

At that moment a strong breeze appeared from nowhere, sending chills up my spine that cooled my entire being. The hair on my arms stood on end, and my mind magically stilled. I felt waves of relaxation and calm.

A short while later, I was guided to join the long line to meet Ram Dass, who had arrived unexpectedly. That day my life changed forever. Unexpectedly, unwanted, and proceeded by much resistance, I received the powerful darshan of Neem Karoli Baba through Ram Dass. I experienced an emotional purification that can only be described as miraculous.

When Ram Dass transitioned in 2019, I felt like I had not had the chance to express authentically my gratitude for that experience. Then a friend sent me this note out of the blue: "We all experience Maharajji in our own personal way, like feeling his presence in the form of a breeze that will suddenly swirl on an otherwise windless day."

This is the way Maharajji works. He's winking at me from the subtle world of siddhaloka*, reminding me that I am still under the blanket."

*Siddhaloka is the abode of liberated, perfect souls, the world of the blessed.

Remembering Peter Kelsey December 30, 1956-September 8, 2023



Oh Peter, God he was funny. And he liked to play hardball in life.

One morning many years ago we met at Ram Dass' breakfast table in Maui. He was brimming in wonder being there, eyes wide open, full of questions - and then came the puns, one after another, each with a sly smile and a glint in his eye. I knew he was my brother instantly. As we came to know each other over the years; I always looked forward to our unvarnished and often peppery conversations.

Peter was seriously honest, like it or not. I loved that he did not mince words, and I can't remember a conversation where he expected a polite exchange in

lieu of what was really happening. It was a kind of generosity that was alive - real conversation. The last week I saw him, he immediately wanted to talk about the journey of dying. Music to my ears, as he didn't want to waste precious time. He understood the gift of life and the ticking clock. And for him, ten years battling cancer was a very hard lesson in this incarnation.

And he was smart, just saw things ahead of time.

He could make or fix anything, be it plumbing or building a plane or making chocolate. I continually marveled at his ability to foresee potential in products and business sectors as well as be a master genius in the kitchen. How does someone get all these gifts? And all done with the right intention: work was a kind of worship. You knew that when you tasted his apple tatin. Incredible. Filled with love.

We frequently talked about surrender. He was always full of questions - because he had a very logical mind and wanted to know what the heck that actually was. Just surrendering was too simple an answer - we would laugh about that. How, what about, if....

But he did. That's playing hardball.

I miss you my lovely friend. We will sit at another table with RD, again.

Remembering Phillip Hollenbeck July 24, 1946-September 24, 2023



Phillip Isaac Hollenbeck was born on July 24th, 1946, in Cumaye Indian Country, San Diego, California. Always a musician, he auditioned with his baritone saxophone for the James Brown horn section at age 17.

While studying at Ali Akbar College of Music in Fairfax, California, he helped form the Digariddim Band with Mickey Hart. In 1967 he went to India and studied classical North Indian music at Benares University, focusing in pakhawaj drumming in the Dhrupad Tradition. First performing with the renowned Dagar Brothers in India and on their first American tour, he then expanded to performing and studying numerous other traditional, folk, tribal, and classical Indian drumming styles.

Returning to India as a MacArthur Fellow, Phil spent time in Orrissa with Satchi Dananda das learning classical Oddissi Dance rhythms, which led to performances with Jyoti Rout. In October 2019, world-famous dancer and singer Parvati Baul came to America and upon meeting Phil asked him to drum for her performances and they became close friends.

Other musicians and dancers that Phil played with include Krishna Das, Erich Avenger, Amelia Cun, a European tour with Prem Kumar, and many more.

Some of his teachers include Amarnath Mishra, Tribhuan Upadhyay, Swami Pagaldas, Mahadev Anandasaraswati, and Pannalal Uphadyay of Bihar.

Hollenbeck was a caretaker at the Neem Karoli Baba Taos Ashram with Tracy Cates in 1997.

He died peacefully at home in Albuquerque, New Mexico.



Sri Siddhi Ma: The Story of Neem Karoli Baba's Spiritual Legacy by Jaya Prasada

"One morning, word spread that Maharajji was visiting the house of Sri Ram Sah, a local businessman. The ladies in Ma's family decided to go for His darshan. Ma went with them, but She sat at the very back of the hall.

Maharajji was surrounded by a large group of devotees. Seeing Ma, He pointed His finger towards Her and gestured for Her to come forward. Ma came up close and offered pranam.

Maharajji immediately went on to give a vivid account of Ma's silent sadhana to the gathering: "the constant flow or Ram's name with each breath She took; Her high meditative state; and how She lived Her life in the world like a lotus in water, yet above the water."

Then Maharajji made the prophetic statement - loud enough for all to hear - that He would make a kuti for Siddhi in Vrindayan."

with great concentration.



Recipe

KITCHARI WITH A TWIST

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 C Basmati rice
- 3 C split yellow mung beans
- 3 TBSP ghee
- 2 TBSP Banyan Kitchari Spice Mix
- 64 OZ Ocean's Halo Thai Coconut Broth
- 8-12 OZ frozen spinach (depends on your taste)
- 8 OZ vegetable broth (in reserve in case you want soupier Kitchari)



- 2. Drain and rinse the rice and mung bean mixture.
- 3. In a large stock pot, melt the ghee.
- Add the rice and mung beans mixture, Banyan Kitchari Spice Mix, Ocean's Halo Thai Coconut Broth, and frozen spinach.
- 5. Cover and bring to a boil
- 6. Reduce heat to simmer and cook for approximately 20 minutes or until rice/mung beans are soft.
- 7. If necessary, add the vegetable broth to thin the mixture.



Treasurer's Report

In many ways 2023 has been a productive financial year. Noted accomplishments include paying off the 421 house (\$232,425); replacing the windows and other necessary upgrades in the Puja Dukan (\$10,149); replacing the roof on the Badri House (\$11,671); installing the outdoor dining enclosure (\$10,583); commencing work on the Sri Siddhi Ma Memorial Garden (in 2023, \$34,887); and beginning construction of Sri Siddhi Ma's Shrine (in 2023 \$16,000).


The Neem Karoli Baba Ashram Puja Dukan
